NOW, THEREFORE, if said Principal, herein named and his/her employees shall indemnify the obligee for all loss that the obligee may sustain by reason of the principal's failure to comply with any of the terms of ORS chapter 830, and will faithfully perform his/her contracts and agreed upon duties to his/her patrons without fraud or fraudulent representation, and shall return all patron deposits following cancellation of services or other failure to provide agreed upon services to patrons, then this obligation shall be void and of no effect; otherwise, to be and remain in full force and effect, subject however, to the following conditions:

- 1. The aggregate liability of the Surety for all or any defaults of the Principal hereunder shall in no event exceed the above set forth penalty of this bond.
